<b>Guiding Question</b>	How does nature influence poetry?	
Lesson Summary	The students will take pictures of nature. Students will then use Alpha Smarts to write a haiku.	
Activating Strategy	<ul> <li>Eighth Grade is Like</li> <li>Prior to students arriving to class place post-its on all the desks.</li> <li>When students enter the room, ask them to place an item on their desk that is not a piece of paper, pencil, or book.</li> <li>The teacher will then tell the students that they are comparing their object to the eighth grade.</li> <li>The teacher will give an example: Eighth grade is like a Kleenex because it is full of tears.</li> <li>The students will create their comparisons of the objects and the eighth grade.</li> <li>Students will then write their comparisons on the post-its.</li> <li>This activity allows students to activate their knowledge of figurative language.</li> <li>The post-its with the comparisons can be posted in the room.</li> </ul>	

Cognitive Strategy			
	Nature Haiku		
	<ul> <li>Teacher will have Alpha Smarts and a digital camera checked out from the library.</li> <li>Students will pick a partner of their own choosing.</li> <li>Before going outside, the teacher will tell students that they have 1 minute to pick an element of nature.</li> <li>Once students have picked their inspiration, they will raise their hand to signal the teacher they are ready to take a picture.</li> <li>Students can choose to be in their picture or not.</li> <li>The teacher will take a picture of nature.</li> <li>Students will then take an Alpha Smart and write their haiku.</li> <li>After writing the haiku, the teacher will lead the students into a computer lab to transfer their poems.</li> <li>The students save their poems to their student folder.</li> <li>The picture of nature and the poem will be cut and pasted onto one sheet and printed.</li> </ul>		
Summarizing Strategy	<ul> <li>Show and Tell</li> <li>Students will share their printed poems with the class.</li> <li>Students will explain their syllable choice.</li> <li>Students will also describe why they decided to write a poem about their particular element of nature.</li> </ul>		
Evaluation	•		
Evaluation	The teacher will monitor student progress while writing the lesson to answer any questions. The printed poems evaluate student understanding. Students have to comprehend the structure of a haiku in order to write their own. The students will also be able to keep a copy of their poem to reinforce the poetry lesson.
